#### **School Devices**

There are some students who are unable, for various reasons, to participate in physical games for an extended length of time. Especially in the heat of summer months. Bringing their own device at school, can provide an alternative. Students are to sit independently and there is a designated area, so that teachers can monitor.

We encourage all of our students to play and exercise during recess and lunch. Our senior students are spending these last few weeks, chatting and talking about their life at Kenthurst Primary School in the Year 6 area. Fond memories to cherish.

A reminder, about the school policy on the use of devices in a school setting

- 7. Inappropriate Conduct
- 7.1 Any student who uses vulgar, derogatory, or obscene language while using a digital device will face disciplinary action as sanctioned by the Principal.
- 7.2 Students with digital devices may not engage in personal attacks, harass another person, or post private information about another person using SMS messages, taking/sending photos or objectionable images, and phone calls. Students using digital devices inappropriately will be dealt with under the school discipline policy and if necessary will be reported to the Police.
- 8. Sanctions
- 8.1 Students who do not obey this policy could have their devices confiscated by teachers. The digital device would be taken to a secure place within the school and the student's parent informed. Appropriate arrangements would then be made for the parents to collect the digital device.
- 8.2 Repeated infringements may result in the withdrawal of the agreement to allow the student to bring the digital device to school.

This explicit contract is required to be read and signed and this is kept in the front office.

# The simplest way

...to make tasty tabouli.

Serves: 6 | Preparation: 10mins | Cooking: 30-60mins Ingredients

½ cup uncooked bulgar\*

2 cups reduced-salt chicken or vegetable stock, hot

2 bunches Italian flat leaf parsley, chopped

1 bunch mint, chopped

3 shallots, chopped

3 Roma tomatoes, chopped

2 tbsp olive oil

2 tbsp lemon juice

### Method

- In a large bowl, pour the boiling stock over the bulgur. Let sit for 30-60 minutes until softened and then strain through a fine mesh sieve. Cool.
- Combine the bulgur, parsley, mint, shallots and tomatoes in a large bowl. In a small bowl, combine the olive oil, lemon juice and pinch of salt. Pour over the bulgur mix and toss to mix well.
- \* Bulgar is a cereal made from whole wheat partially boiled then dried. It can be substituted with couscous or quinoa.


### Did you know?
